The Hindu Religious literature, like Srimad Valmiki Ramayana, Srimad Bhagavtatm, scripture of the Sanatha Dharma, exhaustively addresses curiosity of human beings by covering mainly the origin of the world, creation of flora and fauna, the supreme almighty, the benefactor, human conduct on different stages of life in line with their respective varna ashrama, the real goal of life, ways and means to attain the ultimate salvation, final beatitude.
